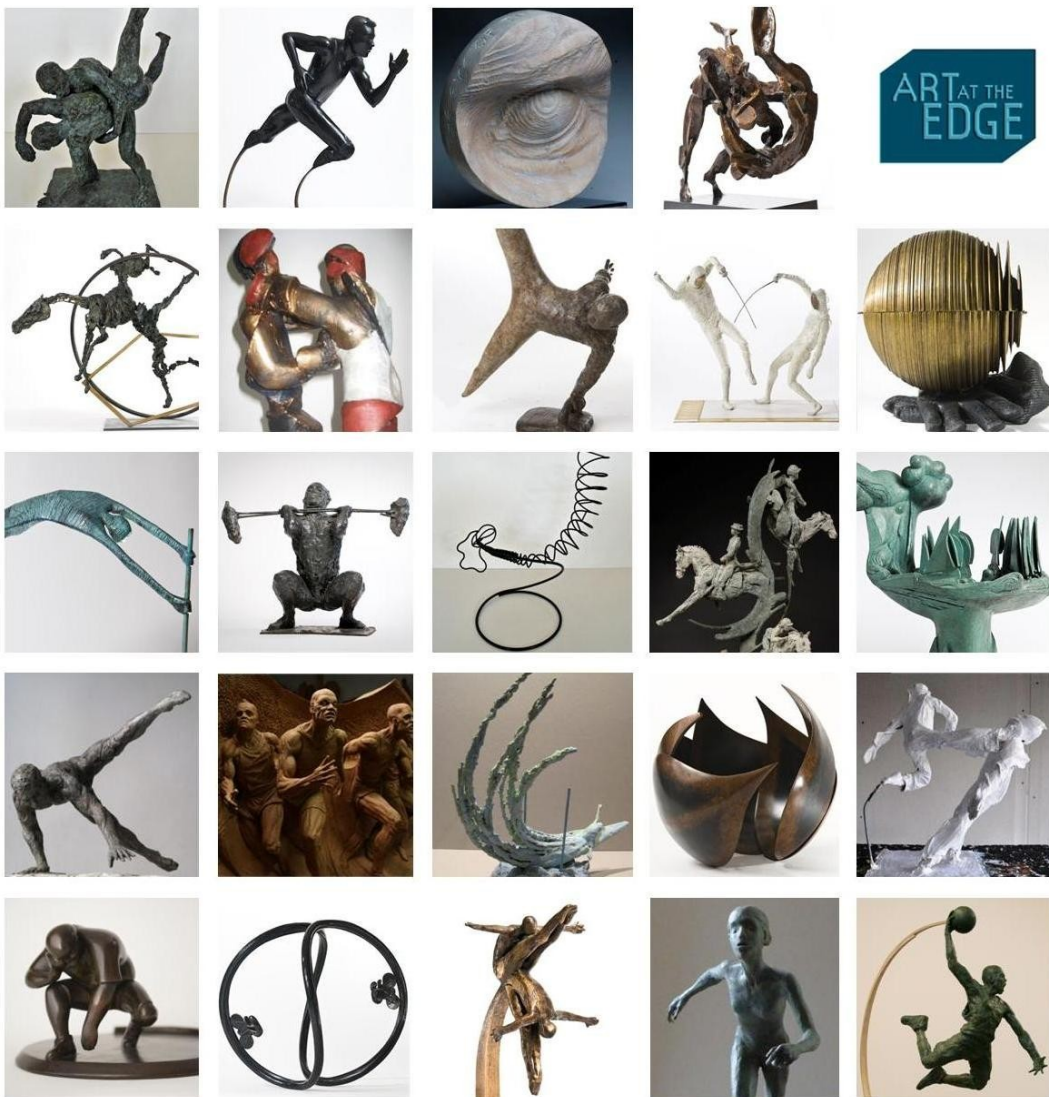
Breaking News

'The People's Lottery' tickets are proving the ultimate stocking filler for Christmas

'The People's Lottery' was launched at our Private View on November 10th. Tickets cost just £10 and give the chance to win a choice of any of the sculptures from the commissioned bronze maquette collection. A winner will be drawn from the lottery on 30th June 2011, with a maximum of 1000 tickets being sold.

The proceeds from the lottery will initially be used to fund the scale-up of one of the sculptures in the collection to life size. This will become part of our city-wide public art trail in Bath in the summer of 2012. We are working with LOCOG to organise exhibiting it at the appropriate Olympic and Paralympic Venue during the Games. It will then be sold as the first in a limited edition and net profits will be donated to our charitable causes.
